## **APPLIED RESEARCH/SURVEY RESEARCH ACTIVITIES**

Founding director of The *Star-Ledger*/Eagleton-Rutgers Poll, a quarterly statewide opinion survey conducted with random samples of New Jersey residents. Each survey investigated 5-7 topics, the results of which were released as public opinion analyses and news stories to the state=s media and attentive political community. In my last stint as director, between 1998 and 2004, we conducted more than 30 statewide surveys and wrote almost 150 releases for the newspaper.

Founding director of the Center for Public Interest Polling, Eagleton Institute of Politics, Rutgers University. Conducted approximately 85 statewide surveys between 1977 and 1988, and between 2002 and 2004, on a variety of public policy issues, largely for state government departments and agencies. Topics included: the environment, education, telecommunications policy, employment, health, transportation, energy, economic development, quality of life.
